

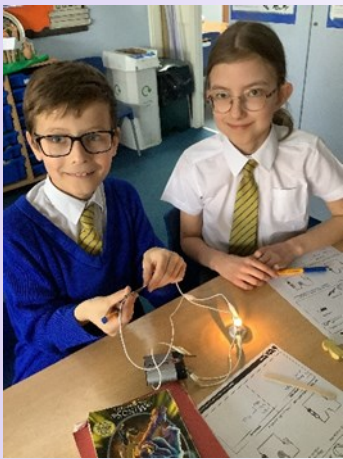
Spring 2 in Penguin class

Maths this term has been looking at drawing and measuring angles; translating and reflecting shapes and finally area and perimeter. We have done lots of practical and accurate drawing!



After light we have moved on to looking at Electricity. We have looked at how electricity is generated: comparing renewable and non-renewable sources and the impact they have on the environment. We have made many circuits each week adding in bulbs and switches and comparing materials for insulators and conductors
